## The Clim-ATIC project and the Lapland Regional Environment Centre have arranged a Climate Change Adaptation Seminar in Rovaniemi on the 4<sup>th</sup> of February 2009.

Clim-ATIC is a three-year international project part-funded by the Northern Periphery Programme. It began in March 2008. It involves community stakeholders working in partnership with public and academic institutions from five regions of northern Europe to explore the potential for different community sectors to develop adaptation capacity, and deliver real adaptations that provide local economic and social advantages. The knowledge gained will be made available through a variety of regional and international dissemination events such as this one and, in the long term, through the establishment of a formal training, education and advice service.

Clim-ATIC project partners and experts from Finland will give presentations about project and related activities. The Seminar is free and will be conducted in English.
