However, students are expected to have a level of competence in English to allow them to fully participate in classes; write essays; undertake assessments (both oral and written) etc. Acceptance letters are normally issued within five weeks after **Acceptance Letters:** submission of an application. These will be sent by email only to the email address provided by the student in their application form.

Students coming for one semester only:	The vast majority of students who are undertaking a one semester study period do not need a student visa to enter the UK ¹ . However, they will require to hold a valid passport. Further information is available from: www.gov.uk/browse/visas-immigration/student-visas * NEW *
	From 2025, all visitors to the UK will require an ETA: www.gov.uk/guidance/check-when-you-can-get-an-electronic- travel-authorisation-eta Please note: some students may require a short-term study visa depending on their nationality
Students coming for a whole Academic Session:	Students who are coming to RGU for a whole Academic Session will need to apply for a Student Visa. The fees for this visa are currently £490 to apply from outside the UK. Students will also have to pay the healthcare surcharge which is around £776. Students will be required to provide evidence of their English language skills (see above)
	Students will also be required to declare whether they have ever applied for a UK visa before or whether have ever claimed asylum in the UK.
	Depending on their nationality, they may also be required to provide a TB certificate and proof of funds.

Registration procedures:	All exchange students must attend a face-to-face Welcome Check on arrival at RGU at which they will be required to produce their passport containing their entry stamp/vignette to the UK as well as their ETA. Students will not be able to enrol until they have attended this appointment. Students will be sent information in late August/early September with details on how to book this appointment.
Transcript of Records:	We do not provide hard copies of Transcripts – students must download these themselves from the RGU app. If a sending institution requires a hard copy, this must be formally requested via studyabroad@rgu.ac.uk Transcripts will only be sent to the sending institution if the student has given us permission to do so. Provisional transcripts for semester one will be available at the
	end of February each year. Official transcripts for semester one and two will be available at the end of June each year.
